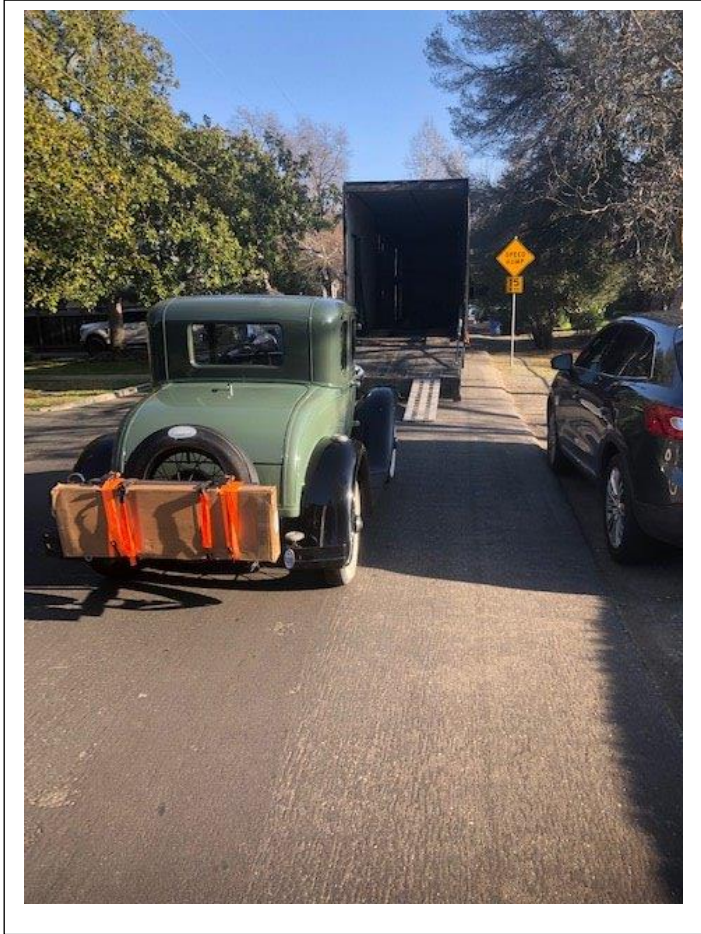

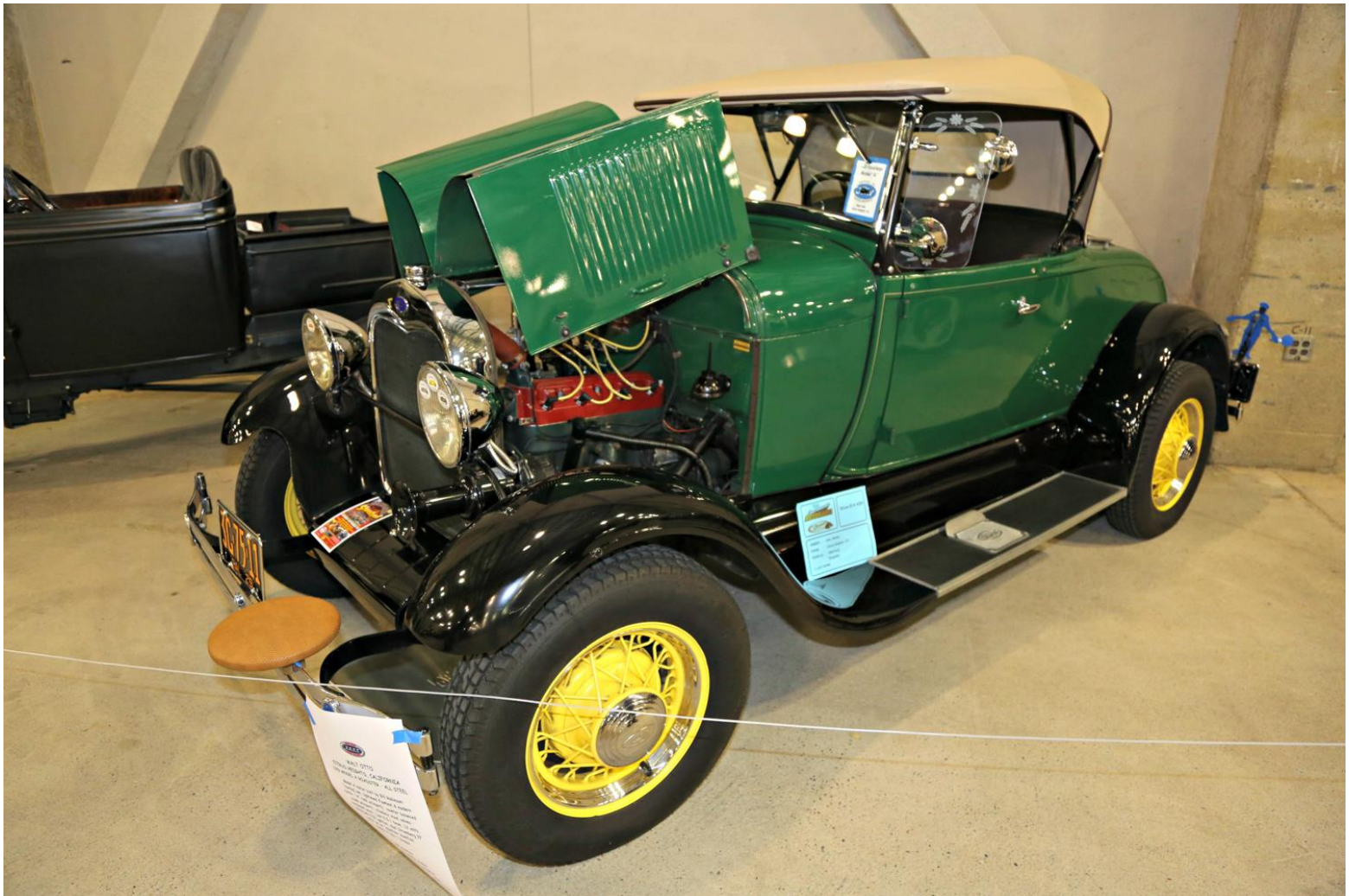

WALT OTTO'S 1929 MODEL A ROADSTER



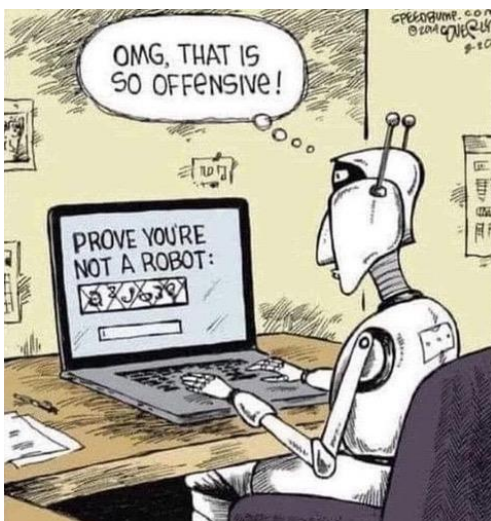

Reproduction of Era Lounging and Beach Pajamas

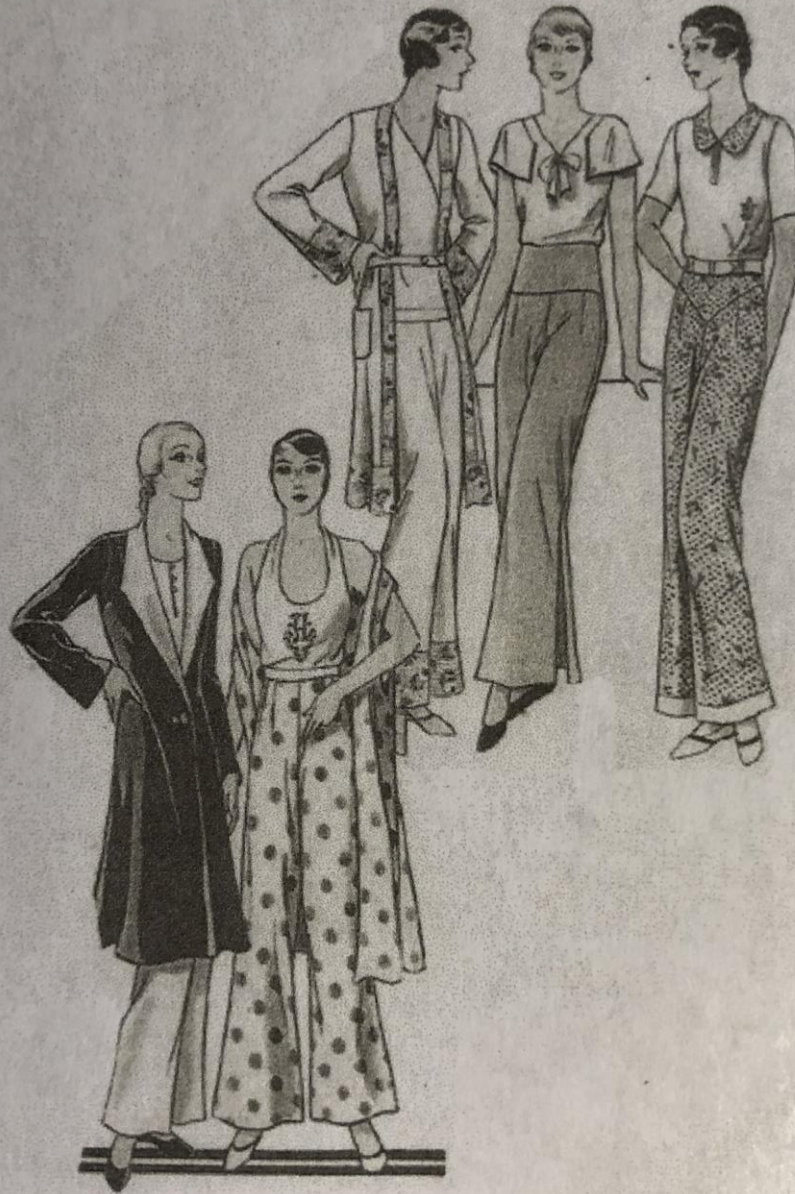


Figure 7. Patterns from "Pictorial Review Quarterly" Fall 1930 shows a variety of styles for lounging/beach pajamas which could have been constructed by the home seamstress. It also demonstrates hair-dos and foot-wear for that time period.
