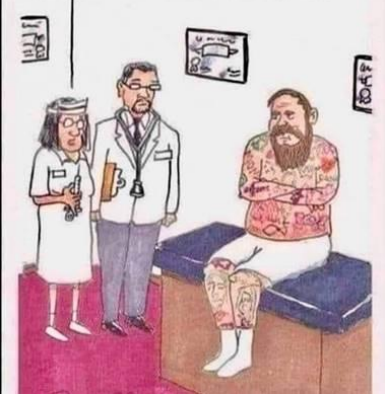

Reproduction of Era Lounging and Beach Pajamas

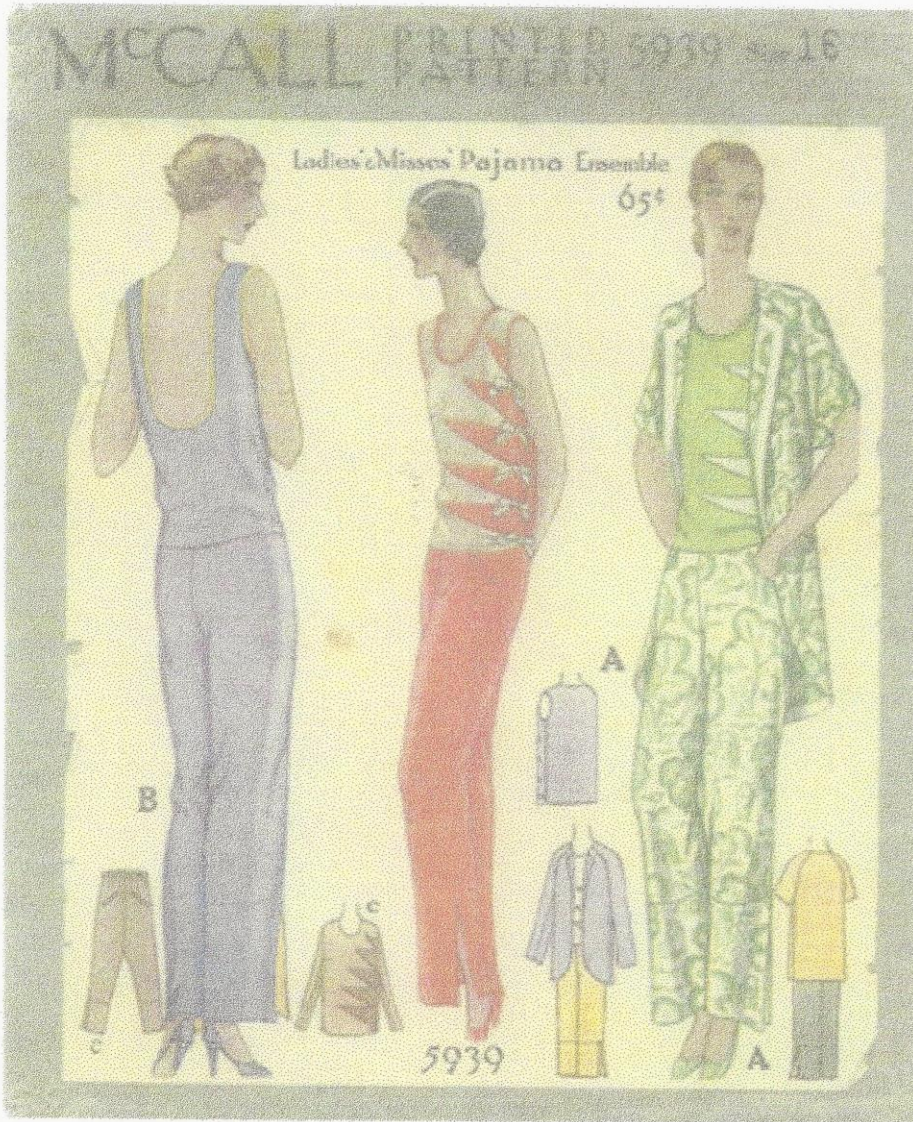


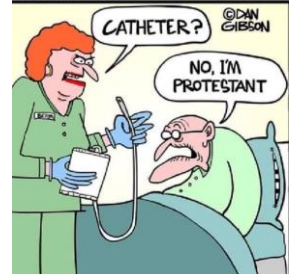
Figure 2: Reproduction of Era fashions requires some research. Original patterns can sometimes still be found at Swap meets or antique stores. The original pattern shown here is for Beach pajamas - copyright 1929 - McCalls. There are also a limited number of original patterns available for temporary use by contacting: Pat Watson, 20124 Beach Drive NW, Stanwood WA 98292.

NCRG Meeting

11:00 AM, Sacramento Ca, Ford Museum 2200 Front Street

The meeting started on time and after a roll call of Chapter present there was a general discussion of what had happened with the coming of the Covid which boiled down to all NCRG planned events were taken off the table by the pandemic and no new events were planned for the duration. Some seemed to give a half try and gave up because of the lack of venue and lodging

Our treasurer is also treasurer of a few other accounts and does his own bit of on line banking also. Like many of us, he fell victim of a hacker that got into several of his accounts and took out a large sum of money. Wells Fargo Bank made the accounts well. Restoring all of the lost funds and so NCRG is still in good hands and funds are as they should be.

A Club that had fronted some money for a planned event was discussed and we voted to make them whole for their loss, as it was none of their fault but rather the fault of the Covid hitting when it did.

Dave Vestel made the point that was obvious from responses to the Presidents call for clubs to take on creating a roundup. The Round ups, as we knew them, two or three day events with judging and

gymkhana's is likely not in our future. Smaller events with a one day event will be the form most likely to survive. Clubs are losing the urge and members able to do more. That is reality of the future of not just the car clubs, but many organizations. So we will be seeing smaller events and feel free to put one on. Rick and I did a sort of spur of the moment one to the Blackhawk museum and the Old School House on Finley Road and I believe that is about what we will see in our future.

Some clubs may get together and host something bigger, but I doubt we will see where one club can do it alone any more. NCRG will provide seed money if a Club need to put up deposits and such so feel free to dream and approach them through your club rep, me, with any and all ideas you may come up with.
