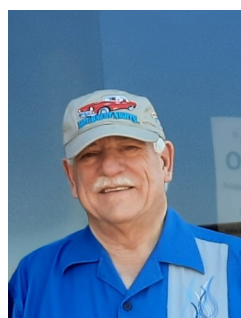

We held our second tour on April 29th to Stewart Indian School in Carson City followed by an enjoyable lunch at Red's 395 Club. The director of the site gave an explanation of the school and its background. This was followed by our being able to view a video presentation of the full history of the 90 years that the school was in operation from 1890 to 1980. Their museum, gift shop and the walking tour of the grounds were most interesting. The grounds are well maintained and many of the original stone buildings that were constructed in the 1920s by the students with guidance by Hopi stone masons from Arizona are still in use and have been taken over by various state agencies. If you have never been to this local Nevada historical site you should take an afternoon and drive over there.

In May we have two functions. The first will be the annual steak fry and pot luck picnic at Bowers Mansion on Sunday May 22nd from 11:00am to 5pm. 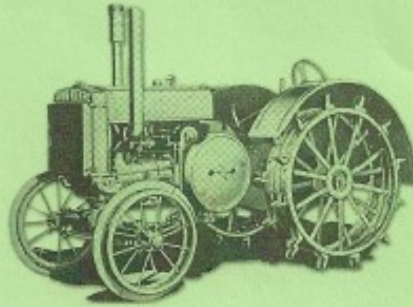
Tour to Paradise Valley May 28 & 29

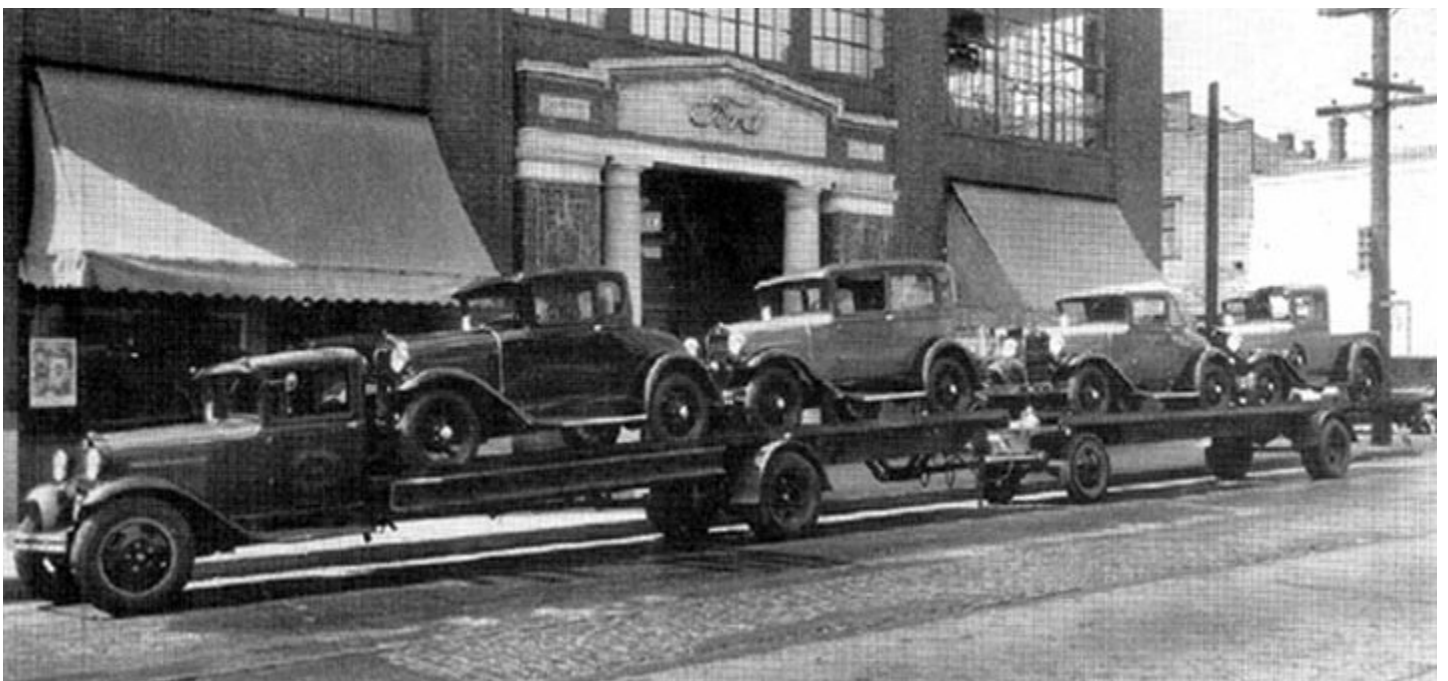

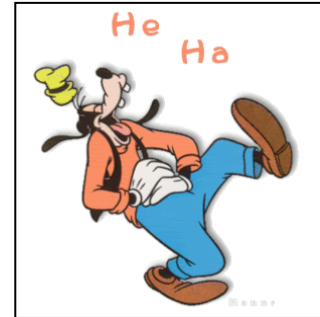
