- Bob did a short seminar on amp meters, shocks and gas tanks.

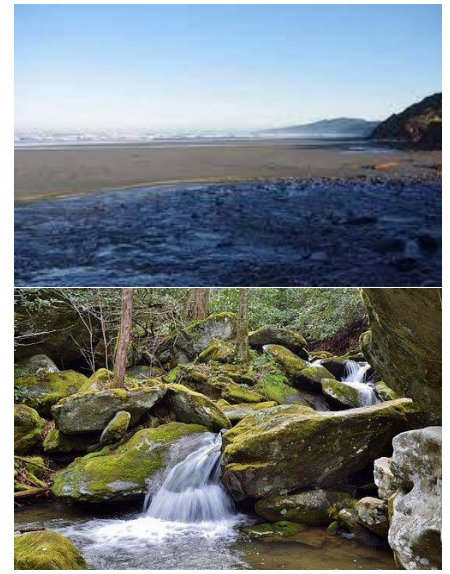
Other:

If you think nobody cares whether you're alive, try missing a couple of payments.

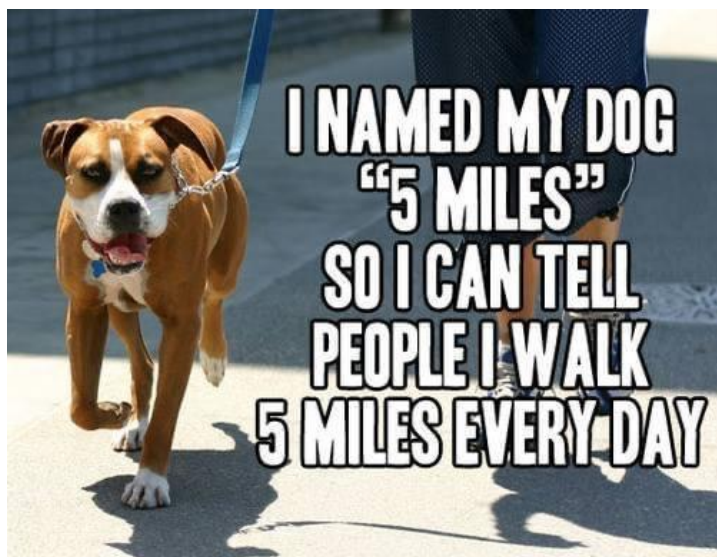
My therapist said that my narcissism causes me to misread social situations. I'm pretty sure she was hitting on me.

Introducing 1930-31 Ladies Evening Fashions

The transition from the 20's to the 30's was most noticeable in the waistline and skirt lengths. Evening wear waists could be belted or slimmed hip hugging garments flaring from the hip. Skirt lengths varied as did the evening wrap. The dress style would decide the length of the coat. Capelets and boleros were worn as part of the dress or as a separate jacket. Sleeves were of prominent interest. Puffed sleeves to the elbow, or the raglan sleeve were effective in giving a slimmer look to waistlines. The bolero reflected the Spanish look, sleeveless for evening wear, designed into the bodice of the dress.

Some gowns had soft bodices which were high like the empire style. There were full skirts, gathered just below the belt or at intervals in the skirt. There were floating panels, pleated flounces, and banded frills. Typical dress treatments were peplums, bolero bodices, pleated insets in the skirts, fitted long sleeves or fitted to the elbow and circular flair from the elbow. Skirts were of irregular length indicating the flaired gather or fuffle, prominent in 1930. The 1931 evening dress was generally the same length all around showing the instep.

Fur and fabric mixed to make interesting evening wraps. Wools woven to velvet softness were available. Short haired furs were seen trimming the dress as well as the coat. Capelets were designed as part of the dress or worn separately.

The lady of leisure took the pajama to the dance floor and wrapped herself in ermine.

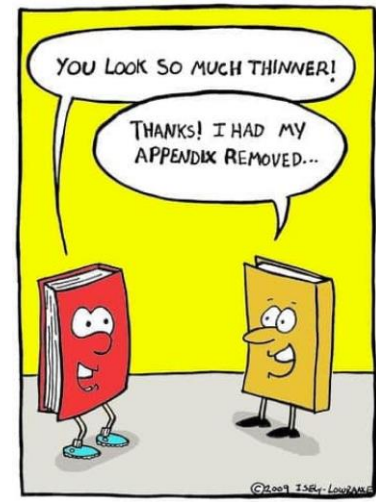
