This person must have general knowledge of web infrastructure as well as a background in HTML editing using applications such as Dreamweaver.

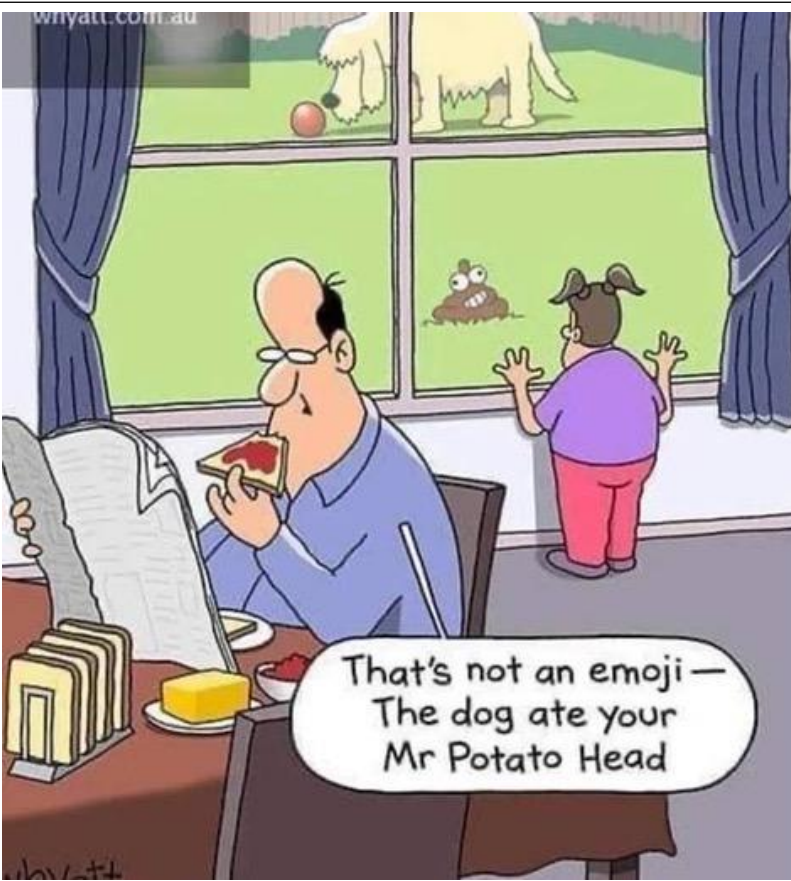

If your love of the Model A extends into the digital world, we could use your help. Here is an opportunity to contribute to the hobby you enjoy.

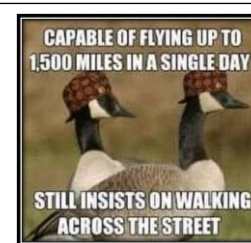
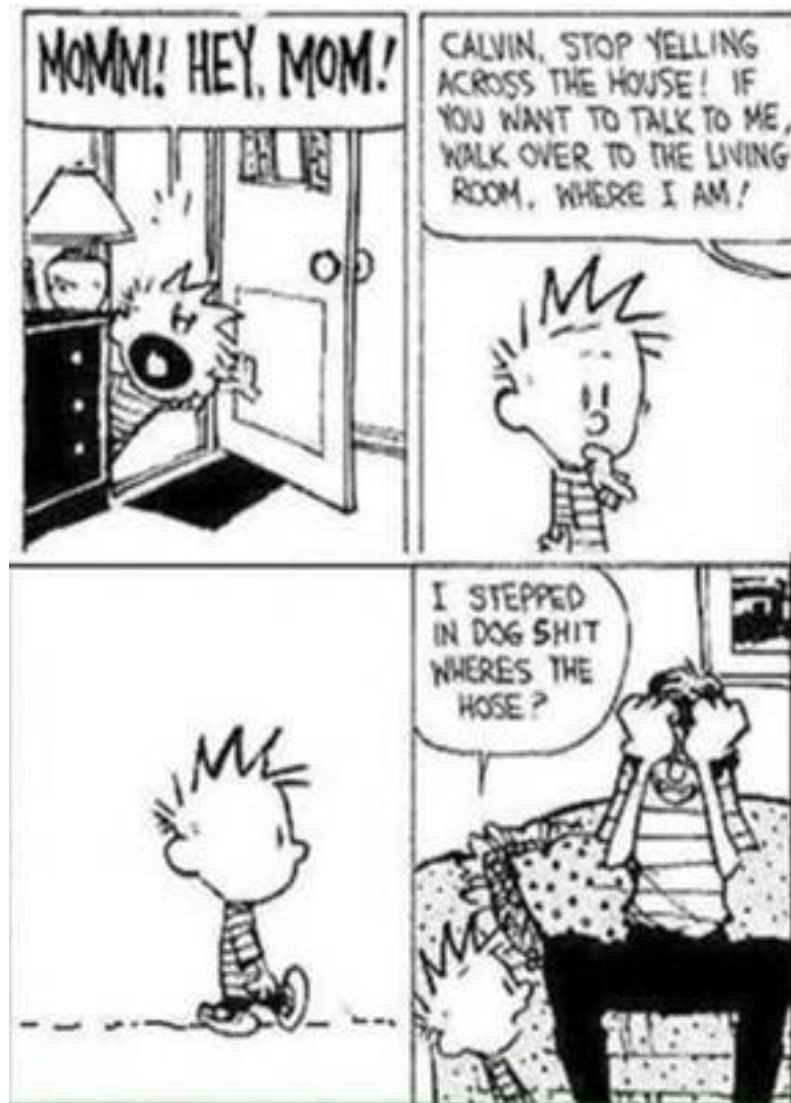

This has been a California car its whole life. Has California title and history. Was inspected and a restored car in 1986. A new owner purchased it and decided to change the color and never got it back together. This is a complete car and virtually everything on it is useable. Has a couple minor body dings and repairs needed but no cancer. Engine does turn but needs a cylinder sleeve in #3 do to sitting with a leaky head gasket for 15 years. Engine in the car matches title and is bored to .060. Body wood is in excellent shape. Very solid around doors and top. Minor area needing repair is to the wood subframe at front seat riser. Very straight forward basic carpentry repair. Has full seat springs but old upholstery was damaged by a raccoon. All New tempered glass except back door glass and it appears original. Shifts easily and chassis is very clean with minimal surface rust. Fenders are all solid. The front and rear fenders on passenger side each have a 1" weld to bead to stop a crack but are not visible.
