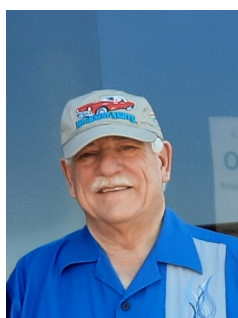

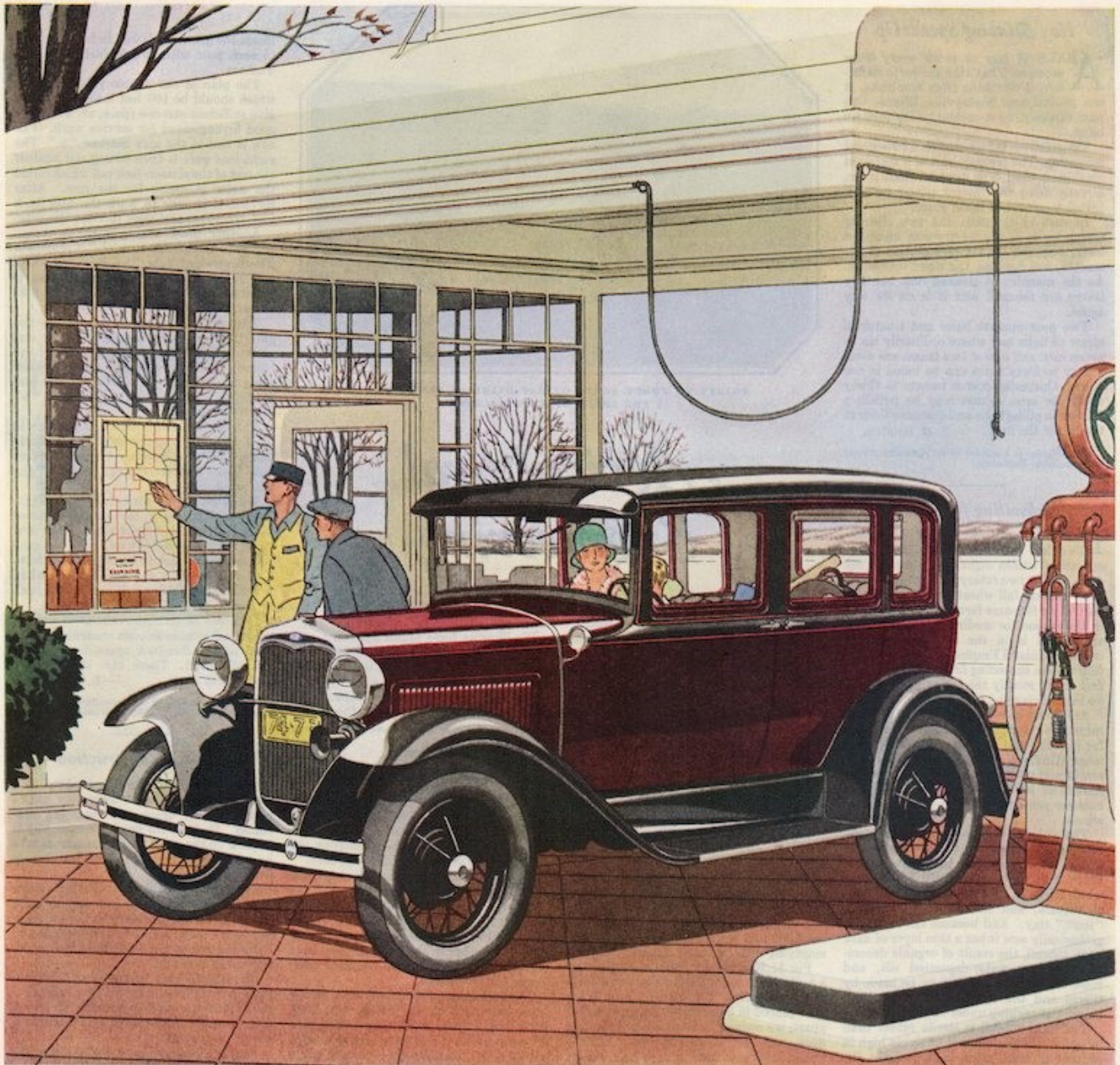

The quality that has been built into every part of the car is the reason for its good performance under all conditions. Its reliability and economy mean a considerable saving each year in the cost of operation and up-keep.



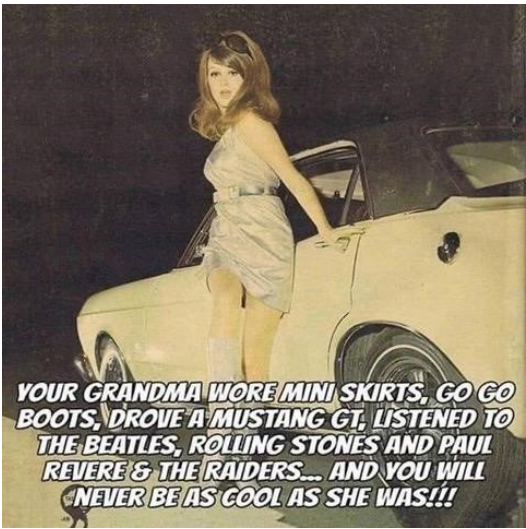
