

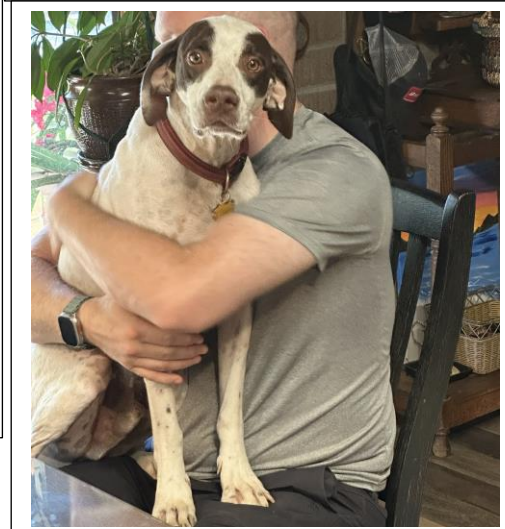
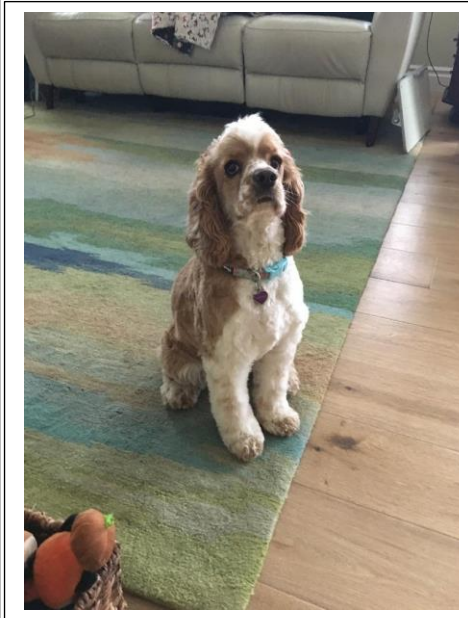
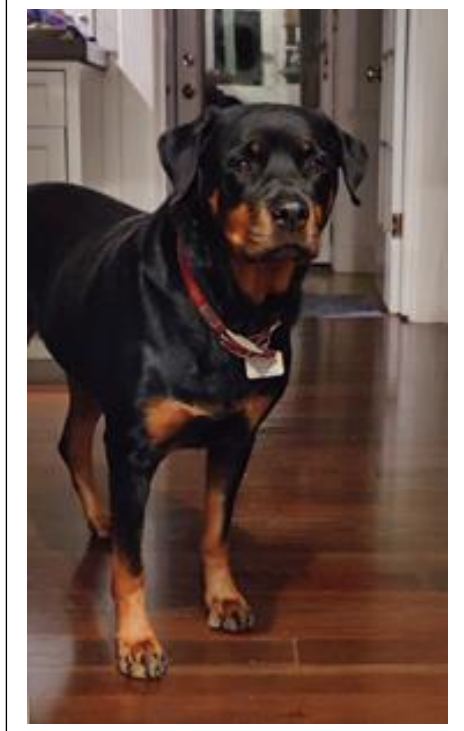

Meeting adjourned at 11:15

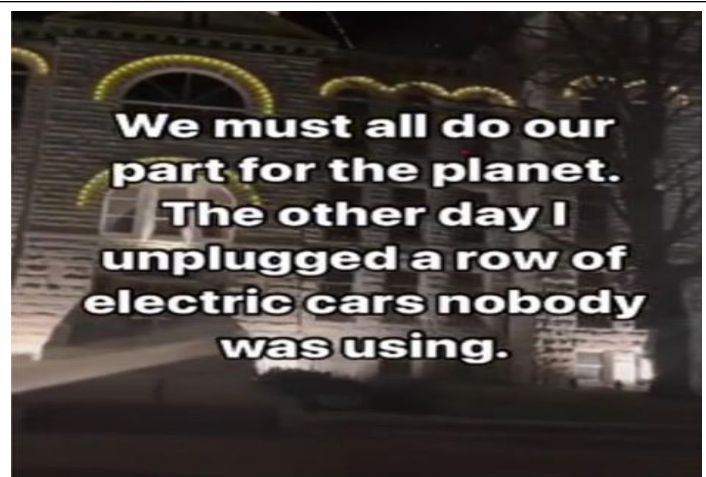
