Recipe Corner

This month's recipe comes from Mona Diamantine

Recipe of the month

Japanese Steak Rolls with Garlic Lime Rice

Recipe makes 16 rolls – total time 45 minutes (it takes me longer to pound out the steaks)

- 1 lb flank steak trimmed
- 16 -8" asparagus spears, trimmed
- 16 -8" pieces scallions, trimmed
- 6 T - seasoned rice vinegar
- 6 T - low-sodium soy sauce
- 4 t - sugar
- 1 T – toasted sesame oil

Slice flank steak across the grain into 16 strips, $\frac{1}{4}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thick. Pound each to about $\frac{1}{8}$ " thick and season with salt and pepper.

Place one asparagus spear and one scallion across the short end of a strip of beef. Roll beef around vegetables and secure with a tooth pick. Place on a shallow baking pan in a single layer; roll remaining beef and vegetables. Combine remaining ingredients, pour over beef and marinate 10 minutes. Meanwhile, prepare Garlic Lime Rice. Preheat broiler to high.

Broil steak rolls 5 minutes. Remove from pan, tent with foil to keep warm and strain marinade into a small sauce pan. Remove toothpicks from steak rolls before serving.

Boil marinade until syrupy, about 5 minutes. Spoon glaze over each serving (use a fine mesh strainer to clarify the marinade before reducing it to a glaze).

Note – roll the beef with a little overlap as possible for more uniform cooking.

You can use other vegetables for the center of the wrap for example; Portobello mushroom slices, bell pepper strips or julienne zucchini

Garlic Lime Rice

Makes 2 cups – total time 25 minutes

- 1 T olive oil
- 3 large garlic cloves, thinly sliced

- 1 C - long-grain white rice
- 2 C - water
- 2 T - fresh lime juice
- 1 t - kosher salt
- 2 T -- minced fresh cilantro
- 2 t - lime zest, minced

Heat oil in a saucepan over medium high, add garlic; sauté 3 min or until golden brown, stir in rice; sauté 2 min. Add water, lime juice and salt; bring to a boil. Cover, reduce heat and simmer 20 minutes or until water is absorbed. Stir in cilantro and lime zest.

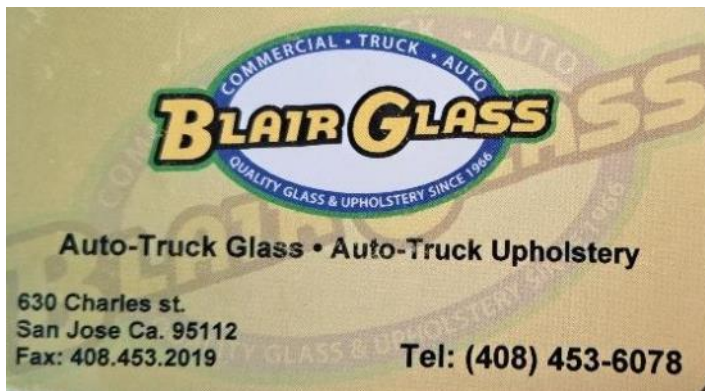

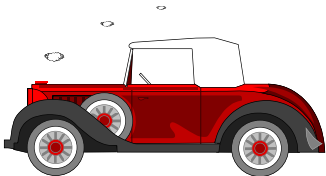
